


1. a large-scale armed forces training exercise 3. following without interruption, as with a term in office Bill - a 1944 federal law that made an educational scholarship available to anyone who had served in uniform during the war; officially called the Servicemen's Readjustment Act Rights Act of 1965 - legislation that (1) required southern states to allow African Americans to return to the voting rolls and (2) outlawed poll taxes 7. _____ tax - a tax paid on the purchase of goods and services, which is collected by the seller 8. limiting the consumption of scarce resources or supplies, such as during a war system - a system designed to ensure that state jobs went to people on the basis of their experience or qualifications for the job rather than on the basis of political patronage 11. a protest in which people refuse to buy certain goods or use certain services until specific conditions are met 12. ___ materiel - equipment and supplies used by soldiers Down 2. Rights Act of 1964 - an act requiring that people be given equal access to public facilities throughout the nation regardless of their race; it also outlawed discrimination in employment, forcing most public agencies to integrate their workforces after 1964 6. people who want to avoid international political and economic relations and instead focus energies and resources on solving a country's own economic problems 8. materials or money paid by a country losing a war to the winners to make up for damages done in the war garden - a garden planted by residents of cities in their yards or on nearby lots to grow their own food during World War II v. Board of Education - a case decided in the U.S. Supreme Court in 1954 that was specifically focused on the desegregation of public schools but that also overturned the "separate-but-equal" provisions of the 1896 Plessy v. Ferguson case

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
